

Captain John G. Haygood, commanding the recently formed Group III (Instrument Squadron), has very successfully carried out the most difficult and one of the most important phases of cadets training. For one month one flight of the instrument squadron is assigned to work with each transition squadron. The last week of that month is taken in giving the 50-3 instrument checks. Capt Haygood's group is independent and works separately, but in conjunction with, the transition squadrons.

1st Lt. Robert Hoagland, assisted by 1st Lt. N. S. Davis, operates the link trainer department at MAAF. At present fifty-six men work from 0600 to 2400 in operation of twenty trainers. Of these men four have attended the instrument school at Bryan, Texas, and three more are now in attendance there. The instrument department also maintains its instructors' school at Marfa to standardize and instruct constantly all those training cadets.


