




### *Credo*

My President's death stunned me like the jolt of a dropped-in landing, left me gasping in half-belief like the sensation of a violent stall. My thoughts raced, wondering, wondering—attempting to comprehend the magnitude of the tragedy, attempting to estimate the danger to that permanent Peace I am flying to win, remembering gravely the disaster of the loss of Lincoln at a time of corollary climax and crisis. I've known the stakes for which I will, if necessary, trade my life in battle. And now I know I would just as surely give my life if Roosevelt could yet live.

But the man is dead; a symbol of vision and courage, a sure beacon past the shoals and reefs of futile War and embezzled Peace is gone; and I, like millions of thoughtful men the world around, am shocked by the almost Sophoclean twist of fate.

As a soldier, I must stoically accept the death in battle of a fellow fighting man. But henceforward, through his example, the world of Peace that men envision and reach out for will have another even more fervent apostle—I so dedicate myself—and my thoughts and my words and my deeds. I will soon be flying a vengeance airship against Japan, and that will be part of it. But more; after the Surrender, I will work for the new Peace among nations by new purposeful example and passionate persuasion. My persistent voice will join others against the clamoring and wrangling of grasping men and nations in the key decades to follow. I will strive more fiercely, I will think more clearly, I will speak more eloquently against stupidity and avarice—in the name of my great President I so dedicate myself.

As the last class to graduate from MAAF during the current training program, we of Class 45-C are beginning to realize the infinite purpose behind the phrase—WE WON OUR WINGS. We begin to understand the true significance of COURAGE, WISDOM, and HONOR, which characterize the great pilots who have preceded us. 





### THE FLYING WHALES


*Here are new creatures for your bestiary:

mirth


Of sun-split clouds—and done a hundred things

Put out my hand and touched the face of God.



For this state's protection.


No longer have we religion
